FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION (1 Corinthians 11:17-34) The Ordinances - Communion

- 1. Is there anything specific from this message that the Lord has impressed upon your heart? If so, what is it & how do you feel the Lord calling you to respond?
- 2. Read the following passages that relate to our practice of Communion:

Exodus 12, Matthew 26:26-29, Mark 14:22-25, Luke 22:14-20, 1 Corinthians 11:17-34

Considering these passages, what is the significance of the consistent practice of The Lord's Supper/Communion? How does the relationship to the Passover meal help to shape our understanding of the representation of the elements?

- 3. Have you had ever any misunderstandings about Communion; if so, how have you grown in your understanding of this ordinance?
- 4. How does the consistent practice of Communion provide a benefit to believers, individually & corporately?

 What are some ways that we partake in an "unworthy" manner resulting in our participation being to our detriment instead?

 With the knowledge that these potential pitfalls are possible, how do we guard against them in our lives?
- 5. What does Communion have to do with the New Covenant and why is the New Covenant in Jesus' blood better than the Old? In light of this, why is Communion commanded to be partaken of only by Christ's followers and only when all together?
- 6. Communion doesn't provide salvation, but it stands as a reminder of the salvation that's ours in Christ.

 Why is it important for us to consistently partake with sincere reverence for Christ if the "elements" are merely physical?
- 7. Below are the "Today's Takeaways" from the end of the sermon.

Do any of these particularly encourage, convict, challenge, you, and if so, how?

1. Salvation is in Christ, NOT the Communion elements!

We're saved by grace through faith in His finished work!

2. All who trust in Jesus alone are invited to partake!

In Jesus - we've been made righteous & should join in joy!

3. Communion is given so we remember Jesus' sacrifice!

We celebrate Communion regularly to keep Jesus first!

4. We participate together - united in our need of Jesus!

Jesus' sacrifice requires humility & selflessness from us!
