PSALMS: The Prayers & Praises of God's People - Psalm 90:1-17 - Our Eternal, Incomparable God - 07.14.2024

- 1. Is there anything specific from this message that the Lord has impressed upon your heart? If so, what is it & how do you feel the Lord calling you to respond?
- 2. Why do you think the concept of time-travel either in fiction or theoretical reality is so intriguing to so many people?
 Do you find yourself drawn to think about these concepts, or is this not as much of a consideration for you personally?
 If so, do you have any favorite books, movies, tv shows, etc. where the concept of time-travel is a key part of the story?
 Since we can only experience time as it moves forward into the future (not backward),
 - Why is it so important to consider the brevity of our time on this earth, and how should that lead us to a heart of wisdom?

 How do passages like Ephesians 5:5-7 help us to understand the implications (and application) of a text like Psalm 90:12?
- 3. How often do you think about who God is and who we are, particularly regarding His eternality vs our brevity of life in this world?

 Why is it so important to have a right understanding of who God is and who we are in relationship to Him as our Creator?

 How does Moses provide an historical theological framework for us in Psalm 90 to better understand this?

Psalm 90:7-11 - THE REALITY OF SIN AND ITS CONSEQUENCES!

 - What does it look like to find full satisfaction in the steadfast love of the Lord in your life?
 - What can you do practically in order to have desires that are rightly-oriented so you find your satisfaction in Jesus?

 As you look at your current schedule, how does what you prioritize reveal about where you seek satisfaction?

 Are there any desires in which you seek your ultimate satisfaction that you need to confess & turn away from?
- 5. Below are the "Today's Takeaways" from the sermon. Do any of these particularly encourage, convict, challenge, you, & if so, how?
